### Meeting readout (held virtually due to COVID-19)

On Mon, 23 Mar 2020 at 17:49, [REDACTED] [@cabinetoffice.gov.uk](mailto:[REDACTED]@cabinetoffice.gov.uk)> wrote:

All - [REDACTED] **[Cabinet Office]** and I had a call with [REDACTED] from BP today at their request.

[REDACTED] **[BP]** said their new CEO spoke to SoS last week; they are keen to help before and at COP26 as appropriate; they offered to support with their convening power or international networks.

I said their 2050 net zero ambition is positive - as with others, and as we're asking all sectors, we are keen to see that translated into short term credible action backed by a robust methodology. Their planned September announcement with details on NZ is important for that. With commitments to SBTi or equivalent, shifting their investment to zero carbon technologies, supporting the phase out of ICE across the world.

[REDACTED] **[BP]** said he heard 'loud and clear' what we were looking for from Sept but couldn't give details now. (He did a bit of expectation management)

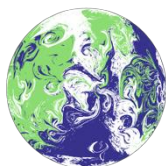
